Guests Giving Thumbs Up

This was the message from our Chair, Rev. Hilary Moore, at our Annual General Meeting. The meeting was held on July 4th at St Thomas Centre, Brampton. Hilary was completing her first year as Chair of Trustees, a role which she has shared with Sam Abel. Hilary, will continue as Chair but, sadly, Sam has had to stand down due to pressure of work. CotB is grateful to her for all of her work and prayers.

Hilary reflected in her Chair's report on the past year. Although CotB is exploring if, where and how its work should change this year has seen the faithful delivery of sessions in Matlock and Chesterfield. The Chesterfield team, supported by the Trustees had to deal with a complex safeguarding issue which meant that some sessions were held outside rather than in, and additional guidelines and training have been made available to all volunteers. The Trustees are grateful to Derby Diocese Safeguarding team for all of their help in this area.

As ever CotB is appreciative of the support from all of our organisational partners and links. A particular highlight this year has been linking with the Chesterfield Law Centre.

Our prayers for new members have been answered in the form of fifteen new people who are working with and for us. More volunteers are still needed, however, so please keep praying, or asking, "Is it me?"

Hilary emphasised in conclusion that the Trustees are still seeking the right way forward: "As trustees we are committed to seeking and managing the future of Church on the Bus, to flexibly responding and developing to changing local and national circumstances and to finding our way forward prayerfully, carefully, and wisely and we all look forward to the next year and what it may bring."

Money

Financially we are in a healthy position for which we give thanks to God and those who give to our work. Our income included a very generous gift of £7,000 from the Pinelog group and 3 other gifts that came from the St Anne's quiz event last December. Just under 60% of our outgoings are on our normal activities while around 40% allows us to provide overnight hotel accommodation which frequently helps support someone in need until the local authority can place them in emergency accommodation.

Operational Updates

Matlock

The team offers hospitality on Tuesday afternoons in a room above Cornerstone Christian Bookshop. The staff in the bookshop are very much part of our guests' experience and we are glad of their involvement. Numbers coming to the session have decreased recently, possibly because provision of hospitality has increased following the Warm Space initiative.

Nevertheless, the relationships in the group are close and precious. We have welcomed Penny to the team, but additional volunteers would help to sustain our hospitality since our team is small, and at the moment, challenged by some of the personal situations facing the volunteers and limiting the time that they can offer. Because of this, sessions will close for the 6-week school holidays as some respite is needed to recharge.

In this last year (Apr22 – Mar23) there have been 1,093 guests in 100 sessions involving 141 men and 41 women of which 23 have attended 10 or more sessions, 74 attended 3 or more sessions and 69 only attended once.

It would be easy to think that the sessions made little difference to the people who come along, but the AGM heard evidence to the contrary.

While collecting furniture Andrew Lamb received assistance from a man who looked familiar. He certainly was having once regularly attended the sessions on the bus, along with his dog. Not only has this gentleman turned his own life around but he is also helping others. As Andrew reported, "It is all worth it!"

Recently **Tesco Extra** in Chesterfield telephoned and asked Ian to call in to accept a donation. This is a regular event since **Tesco** have supported CotB with regular food donations for a few years. However, this was no ordinary donation. The **Tesco Community champions**, Jane and Karen had raised £300 for CotB from a display which they had promoted for two weeks. We are very appreciative of all the support that Tesco gives; this donation will probably go towards some more sleeping bags to boost our stocks ahead of winter.
